The emergence of sound technology sparked a natural expansion, taking the musical genre from the stage to the big screen. Multiple camera angles, the ability to shoot at various locations and the use of lavish background scenery that would be impractical in a theater allowed filmed productions to outshine live performances.

Interest in musicals increased dramatically in the mid-1930s when director Busby Berkeley (Take Me Out to the Ball Game, The Gang's All Here, For Me and My Gal) began to

enhance traditional dance routines with his unique style. His creative numbers would typically begin on stage, then gradually transcend the limitations of theatrical space by filming from above, capturing dancers forming kaleidoscope-esque patterns.

As the motion picture industry grew with the development of special effects, increased quality of film technology and the introduction of color, the musical genre experienced sustained popularity for decades.

The Golden Age of Musicals boasts more than 25 hours of song, dance and comedy that will dazzle and entertain, from slapstick to romance to over-the-top opulence. Featuring the best films and biggest stars of the era, including Fred Astaire in Second Chorus, Danny Kaye in The Inspector General, Bing Crosby and Bob Hope in Road to Bali, Dean Martin and Jerry Lewis in At War With the Army, Judy Garland in Till the Clouds Roll By and many more, The Golden Age of Musicals is a must-have collector's set for fans new and old!

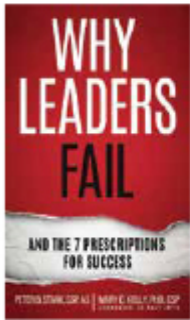
Rod Serling's (The Twilight Zone, Planet of the Apes, Seven Days in May, Requiem for a Heavyweight) tale of ruthless men and ambitious women clawing for control of a billion-dollar empire first aired live in January 1955 on Kraft Television Theater. The hard-hitting teleplay was such a success – earning Serling instant acclaim and the first of his six Emmy awards – that producers Jed Harris (Operation Mad Ball, The Light Touch, Broadway) and Michael Myerberg (Hansel and Gretel) with director Fielder Cook (Seize the Day, A Big Hand for the Little Lady) helmed a big screen feature for United Artists, using most of the original cast.

The result was an acid-etched chronicle of the cutthroat corporate world, starring Van Heflin, Everett Sloane and Ed Begley, with cinematography by Oscar-winner Boris Kaufman (On the Waterfront, 12 Angry Men). Now, presented in its original theatrical aspect ratio, this gripping drama has received The Film Detective treatment, offering loss-less DTS-HD sound and picture quality like never before.

In Patterns, businessman Fred Staples (Heflin, Airport, 3:10 to Yuma, Shane, The Strange Love of Martha Ivers) is plunged into the rough-and-tumble of office politics at his new job when he discovers that he is meant to replace the decent-but-ailing vice president, Bill Briggs (Begley, Hang 'Em High, The Unsinkable Molly Brown, 12 Angry Men, Guiding Light). See Frank Sinatra as a Savage, Sensation-Hungry Killer

Frank Sinatra is unforgettable as a psychotic war veteran hell bent on assassinating the president in the 1954 classic **SUDDENLY** – available on Blu-ray from The Film Detective (distributed by Allied Vaughn).

It's not every day the president comes to town ... When he makes a stop in sleepy Suddenly, Calif., things liven up after a possible assassination attempt comes to light.

In a house atop a hill overlooking the train station where the president will arrive, three gangsters, led by John Baron (Frank Sinatra, From Here to Eternity, The Manchurian Candidate, On the Town), have taken hostages Pop Benson (James Gleason, The Night of the Hunter, Arsenic and Old Lace, Meet John Doe), his daughter Ellen (Nancy Gates, Some Came Running, World Without End) and her son Peter III, a.k.a. "Pidge" (Kim Charney, The Werewolf, Man From God's Country).

Local sheriff Tod Shaw (Sterling Hayden, The Godfather, Dr. Strangelove, The Asphalt Jungle) and Secret Service agent Dan Carney (Willis Bouchey, The Man Who Shot Liberty Valance, The Big Heat, Pickup on South Street) are pitted against Baron, who's determined not to let anyone stand in his way.

Baron is good with a gun and has the perfect vantage point, all he has to do is keep a cool head ... But can he? This cold-blooded thriller from director Lewis Allen (The Uninvited) feels as savage as it did decades ago when the *New York Times* called Sinatra's performance, "a melodramatic tour de force."
